Dear Parent/Guardian,

We are writing to make you aware of the government changes with regards to Relationships and Sex Education (RSE), which statutory guidance requires all schools to teach from September 2020.

The aim of RSE is to put in place the building blocks needed for positive and safe relationships of all kinds, starting with family and friends, and moving out to other kinds of relationships, including online. Today's children and young people are growing up in an increasingly complex world and living their lives seamlessly including online. This presents many positive and exciting opportunities, but also challenges and risks. In this environment, children and young people need to know how to be safe and healthy and how to manage their academic, personal and social lives in a positive way.

At Royton and Crompton E-Act Academy, we embrace the requirement to teach RSE for the following reasons:

- We want children to have positive relationships and friendships which understands boundaries and privacy.
- We want all children to feel safe and welcome in our academies.
- We want children to treat each other with kindness, consideration and respect.
- We want children to recognise and respect differences and ensure that no child is stigmatised based on their home circumstances and needs.
- We want children to have the skills and knowledge they need to keep themselves safe, both in the "real world" and online
- We want to meet our legal responsibilities as educators, to promote fundamental British Values and meet the public sector requirements of the Equalities Act 2010.

We also understand that it is our responsibility to:

- teach RSE in a way that is age and developmentally appropriate.
- expect tolerance as a minimum.
- promote acceptance, respect and understanding.
- prepare children for life in modern Britain.
- develop policies and schemes of work for our individual academies, as part of our overall curriculum, which are unique to each academy.

















We have worked tirelessly to improve the relevance and contents of our curriculum content since our last Ofsted report and are extremely proud to promote and celebrate equality, diversity and individuality within PSHE lessons and throughout other subjects. This has led to us achieving the Rainbow Trust standard and being deemed as outstanding practitioners in several areas. We have a very popular (weekly) Rainbow Planet group, which numerous students attend and through it have organised fundraising events for local LGBTQ+ charities. This is something both staff, students and trustees are extremely proud of.

An overview of our RSE is attached. It is clearly evident that the emphasis moves from the experience of the child in the context of their family to the young person as a potential partner and parent, and the characteristics of healthy, and unhealthy, intimate relationships. We cover the concepts of, and laws relating to, sex and relationships, as well as the effects of relationships on their mental wellbeing. We are confident that we educate pupils about the world in which they are growing up and are inclusive of all, whatever their developing sexuality or identity, bearing in mind the age, development and religious backgrounds of their pupils.

We recognise, however, that parents are the primary teachers of their children and are able to request that their child be withdrawn from the sex education element of RSE.
