

We have linked to careers this half term by improving students' confidence to express their ideas. We have linked to Fundamental British Values this half term by exploring the representation of British culture through a range of texts.

Extra Curricular activities this half term have included, Press Club The Debating Society.

### Key Stage 3

In KS3 English, students have been studying Victorian literature this term which has been hugely enjoyable. Students have worked hard to access these texts taken from our Literary cannon, from Oliver Twist in year 7, Sherlock Holmes in year 8 and Jane Eyre in year 9, all have risen to the challenge of this demanding work and we are hugely proud of the progress they are making.

In addition, students continue to improve their literacy skills through their Mastery Writing lessons. This study is integral to students' progress and we are delighted that students continue to work hard in this challenging area. This term, Year 8 became journalists researching and writing about the 'Cost of Living Crisis'. We feel it is important that our school community understand the important political issues of the day.

We were also delighted to hear that some of our students have won a national competition for their Poetry writing. Led by our wonderful Miss Wong, last year, students worked on the project 'The Globe Re-imagined'. Having won the competition, the work of Ava Hobson and Menaz Khatun will be published alongside the work of some of our leading poets. Look out for the new anthology in our Academy library!

#### Key Stage 4


Year 11 have had a great start to their final GCSE year. Year 11 have been focusing on the Literature curriculum, during their English lessons, studying two plays:' An Inspector Calls' by J. B. Priestley. During their form time and intervention sessions on a Tuesday and Thursday, they have been focusing on their English Language skills. When they return after half-term students will be sitting their first mock examinations. We know this can be a very stressful time for the students so we want to support you and them as much as possible. Students have been given revision guides and booklets to help them organise their revision time. If you have any queries about how to support them, please do get in contact with their class teacher..

The Year 10s this term, have focussed on Language paper 1 skills and they will move on to 'A Christmas Carol' by Charles Dickens when they return in November. At the beginning of November, the students will complete their first mock examination on Language Paper 1.

We continue to use TEAMS as a platform to share homework and this term have also introduced SENECA. If there are any concerns about access to either of these platforms, please speak to the IT. team.

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Super September has been a busy month in the maths department. Our Hegarty learning platform has been replaced by Sparx. This sets individual homework based on an algorithm which learns the students' capabilities over time. The homework is set automatically each Wednesday and students are expected to achieve 100% on their personalised tasks each week.

Finding a guestion tricky? Watch the mini tutorial video!

On Sparx, students can build up their experience points (XP) by undertaking optional extras like the XP sessions or independent learning. Watch out for lots of celebrations and prizes related to Sparx over this year!

Congratulations to these bright Sparx so far: Thomas B, Jessica M, Ryan B.

We have also been really busy with early interventions. Extra maths sessions have been launched on a rolling program to target those who need a little extra help. We also have maths intervention classes led by tutors after school and the department has welcomed two maths amazing tutors to its team as well as two fantastic trainee maths teachers.

### Key stage 3

Year seven have made an excellent start to their life at high school concentrating on number. They have been working on place value, factors multiples and primes, HCF and LCM, multiplying and dividing with powers of 10 and four operations with decimals. They have made the best start with their Sparx homework and are currently top of the whole-school leaderboard.

Year eight have studied operations with fractions and then the exciting, hands on topic of probability, whilst year nine have focused on converting fractions decimals and percentages, then concentrated on percentages specifically looking at simple and compound interest – maths in the real world!

### Key stage 4

In Year 10, students have been perfecting their angle facts and applying them to new problems, including tessellation and bearings. This has then developed with the next topics of Pythagoras and Trigonometry (SOH CAH TOA), to give students a great coverage of Geometry this half term.

In Year 11, fortnightly assessments have given students an insight to the GCSE style questions they will see in their Mocks and their final assessments at the end of the year. These have led to covering standard form, substitution and rearranging, product rule for counting, best buys, currency and angles in polygons.

#### Keyworkers

All of our students on the SEND Register have a designated keyworker. Your child should have had an initial check-in with their keyworker and parents/carers should have had a phone call or email from their child's keyworker to introduce themselves. Please contact the SEND department if you have not yet received contact/communication or if your child is not sure who their keyworker is. The role of a keyworker is to ensure communication between school, home and the student. Keyworkers will aim to form positive working relationships with students and become another 'familiar-face' in the building for students to feel they can go to for support, when required.



### An overview of what we have been studying this half term:

We have been investigating the formal elements in art; line, tone, texture, colour, shape and pattern. We
have also begun creating a portrait, learning about proportions and placements.
We have started a project entitled 'Our Living World.' Students have investigated what this means to them,
before learning how to take photographs and create collages in the style of Ernst Haeckel.
We have started a project entitled 'Our Surroundings.' We have investigated what this means, before
studying a local artists named Chris Cyprus. We have been recreating his artwork using acrylic paint with a
focus on colour mixing.
Year 10 have explored the art movement Surrealism. They will be taking inspiration from this movement to
create 'out pf place' portraiture. Students have so far been recalling how to produce a portrait study, before
taking a set of their own portrait photographs to draw from.
Year 11 have been continuing to develop their own independent projects. Last term, students selected an
art them, which they have since been exploring; researching artists, experimenting with media. Soon they
will begin to plan for their final outcome.

### An overview of what we will be studying next half term

YEAR /:	Researching the artist Pablo Picasso before creating their own mixed media portrait art inspired by cubism.
YEAR 8:	Developing their artwork using print making techniques, before developing their outcomes further

- through experimentation of different media.
  YEAR 9: Students will be refining their paint skills through the exploration of further artists such as Vincent Van Gogh and David Hockney.





A Cognitive Behavioural Therapist is a type of Psychologist who supports people with issues such as depression and addictions, to change the way they think about and respond to situations. They work for the NHS or in private practice and often have a background in Psychology including being educated to university level in a Psychology related degree. They have a very good starting salary of approximately £32,000 a year which can rise to at least £46.000 a year A second second
