





Keyworkers

All of our students on the SEND Register have a designated keyworker. Your child should have had an initial check-in with their keyworker and parents/carers should have had a phone call or email from their child's keyworker to introduce themselves. Please contact the SEND department if you have not yet received contact/communication or if your child is not sure who their keyworker is. The role of a keyworker is to ensure communication between school, home and the student. Keyworkers will aim to form positive working relationships with students and become another 'familiar-face' in the building for students to feel they can go to for support, when required.

Coffee Mornings

We would like to start running our Coffee Mornings and/or Coffee Afternoons again for parents/carers who have children on the SEND Register. These were successful last year. It can be a good opportunity for parents/carers to meet your child's keyworker and/or the SENCO, Deputy SENCO and to see work which your child has produced in lessons. Please can you email emma.brough@rca.e-act.org.uk (Deputy SENCO) with the best day/time you could attend, so we can try and schedule these for times which can suit everyone.
