

Key Stage 3

In KS3 English, students have been studying a range of literature this term which has been hugely enjoyable. Students have worked hard to access these texts taken from our Literary cannon, from poetry in Year 7 and 9 to 'Animal Farm' in Year 8.

In addition, students continue to improve their literacy skills through their Mastery Writing lessons. This study is integral to students' progress and we are delighted that students continue to work hard in this challenging area. This term, the students have been working on their writing to describe skills and their writing to argue skills.

Key Stage 4

Year 11 have had a hugely successful exam season, applying themselves studiously and maturely to the demands of the GCSE season. We are extremely proud of their focus and academic approach. We are super excited to share their results with them in August which we hope will be representative of their hard work.

Year 10 have been focusing on the Literature curriculum during their English lessons. The students have been studying 'An Inspector Calls' by J.B. Priestley and 'Macbeth' by William Shakespeare. 


In their coasts unit, Year 10 have been using their knowledge of coastal processes (and cake!) to produce annotated models of features of erosion, in a headland.

I am Miss Shaw I sit in an area within the academy called "The Hub". The intention of the hub is to provide drop in sessions, groupwork and 1:1 Emotional Health and Wellbeing support, for our student. This is on a referral basis. We run the Hub at dinner and this is a place where students can come if they need a quiet space.

Over the year we have run activities on Mental Health Days and Mental Health Week. We have completed questionnaires to get student voice on their own mental health and wellbeing.

Recently the year 9's and 10's completed a questionnaire called #BeeWell and this was rolled out across Greater Manchester to get an idea of how young people in our area are feeling about themselves and the place that they live. Five of our year 9 students looked at the results of the questionnaire and met with Local Council Leaders in Oldham to present this data and come up with some suggestions of how Oldham can be improved to increase the mental health and wellbeing of students in Oldham.

We have run a program called Social Switch, in which our year 10 students taught our year 7 students about online safety.

A regular bulletin around mental health and wellbeing is sent out and we run a parent coffee morning where parents can drop in to discuss anything they are concerned or worried about for themselves or their child.
